AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE RETIREMENT OF JUDGES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 65D of Chapter 32 of the General Laws is hereby further
2 amended by inserting after the first sentence of paragraph (c) the
3 following sentence: —

4 Each such judge first appointed to judicial office on or after
5 January second, Nineteen hundred and seventy-five and who (1)
6 shall be retired under Article LVIII of the Amendments to the
7 Constitution, or (2) shall have served in such office or offices for
8 at least ten years continuously, and has attained the age of sixty-
9 two years but not having attained the age of sixty-five years, and
10 shall resign his office, shall thereupon be entitled to secure a
11 retirement allowance for life at an annual rate equal to two-thirds
12 of the annual rate of salary payable to him at the time of such
13 retirement or resignation.
