HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, May 24, 1887.

The Committee on the Liquor Law, who were instructed to inquire into the expediency of providing by law that officers serving warrants to search for intoxicating liquors may seize such liquors, the vessels in which they are contained and all implements and furniture used in the sale of such liquors, have considered the same, and report the accompanying Bill.

AN ACT

Providing for the Seizure of Implements and Furniture used in the Illegal Selling of Intoxicating Liquors.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section thirty of chapter one hun-
2 dred of the Public Statutes is hereby amended by
3 adding the words "and all implements of sale and
4 furniture used in the sale of such liquor," after the
5 word "contained" in the fifteenth line of said
6 section.

1 SECT. 2. Section thirty-three of chapter one
2 hundred of the Public Statutes is hereby amended
3 by adding the words "and implements of sale
4 and furniture used in the sale of such liquor," after
5 the word "contained" in the third line of said
6 section.

1 SECT. 3. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
