An Act concerning the appointment of Appraisers in Civil Process. *Chap. 1*

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :*

SECT. 1. The act entitled "An Act concerning the appointment of Appraisers in Civil Process," approved May 24th, 1851, is hereby repealed. Former act repealed.

SECT. 2. No appraisal made since the said act took effect shall be invalid for want of conformity to the provisions thereof: *provided*, the same were made in conformity to the provisions of law existing previously to the passage of said act. Previous appraisements not invalid, provided, &c.

SECT. 3. Wherever appraisers are appointed by virtue of the provisions of law relating to any civil process in the hands of any officer authorized to serve the same, such appraisers may be sworn by said officer. Appraisers to be sworn.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect from and after its passage. Takes effect. [*Approved by the Governor, January 23, 1852.*]

An Act concerning the Boston Dispensary. *Chap. 2*

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :*

That the Boston Dispensary be, and it hereby is, authorized and allowed to make purchases, and to receive grants May make purchases and receive grants
