## Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Ninety-five.

### AN ACT

In addition to an Act making Appropriations for Expenses authorized the Present Year and for certain Other Expenses authorized by Law.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned  
2 are appropriated to be paid out of the treasury  
3 of the Commonwealth from the ordinary revenue,  
4 except as herein provided, for the purposes speci-  
5 fied in certain acts and resolves of the present  
6 year and for certain other expenses authorized  
7 by law, to wit:—

8 For additional clerical assistance in the office  
9 of the register of probate and insolvency for the  
10 county of Essex, as authorized by chapter one  
11 hundred and seventy-four of the acts of the  
12 present year, a sum not exceeding fifteen hun-  
13 dred dollars.

14 For the salary of the first deputy controller  
15 of county accounts, as authorized by chapter one

16 hundred and seventy-five of the acts of the  
17 present year, the sum of two hundred and  
18 twenty-five dollars, the same to be in addition  
19 to the amounts appropriated for the salaries of  
20 the deputies of the controller of county accounts,  
21 authorized by chapter forty-nine of the acts of  
22 the present year.

23 For expenses in connection with locating and  
24 defining the boundary lines between the towns  
25 of Melrose and Stoneham, and the town of Lex-  
26 ington and the city of Waltham, as authorized  
27 by chapters one hundred and eighty-two and two  
28 hundred and twenty-nine of the acts of the  
29 present year, a sum not exceeding five hundred  
30 dollars, the same to be in addition to any amount  
31 heretofore appropriated for the determination of  
32 boundary lines of cities and towns by the com-  
33 missioners on the topographical survey.

34 For the compensation of the doorkeepers, as-  
35 sistant doorkeepers, postmaster, messenger and  
36 pages of the senate and house of representatives,  
37 as authorized by chapter one hundred and ninety-  
38 three of the acts of the present year, a sum not  
39 exceeding thirty-seven hundred dollars, the same  
40 to be in addition to any amount heretofore appro-  
41 priated for the same purpose.

42 For the payment by the Commonwealth of  
43 tuition of children attending school outside the  
44 town in which they reside, as authorized by chap-  
45 ter two hundred and twelve of the acts of the  
46 present year, a sum not exceeding five thousand  
47 dollars.

48 For assistance, experts, chemists, agents and  
49 other necessary expenses of the state dairy  
50 bureau, as authorized by chapter two hundred  
51 and fourteen of the acts of the present year, a sum  
52 not exceeding three thousand dollars, the same to  
53 be in addition to the four thousand dollars appro-  
54 priated by chapter fifteen of the acts of the present  
55 year.

56 For authorized expenses of the committees of  
57 the present legislature, to include clerical assist-  
58 ance to the committees authorized to employ the  
59 same, a sum not exceeding five thousand dollars,  
60 the same to be in addition to any amounts hereto-  
61 fore appropriated for the same purpose.

62 For printing and binding two thousand addi-  
63 tional copies of the blue book, so-called, in  
64 addition to the number now required to be  
65 printed, as authorized by chapter two hundred  
66 and fifty of the acts of the present year, a sum  
67 not exceeding nine hundred and seventy-five  
68 dollars.

69 For expenses in connection with the organiza-  
70 tion of the new state normal schools, provided for  
71 by chapter four hundred and fifty-seven of the  
72 acts of the year eighteen hundred and ninety-  
73 four, as authorized by chapter two hundred and  
74 fifty-eight of the acts of the present year, a sum  
75 not exceeding six thousand dollars, to be paid out  
76 of the moiety of the income of the Massachu-  
77 setts school fund applicable to educational pur-  
78 poses, and the excess, if any, from the treasury  
79 of the Commonwealth, the same to be in addition

80 to the amount appropriated for the support of  
81 state normal schools in chapter forty-one of the  
82 acts of the present year.

83 For the salary of the legacy tax clerk in the  
84 office of the treasurer and receiver-general, as  
85 authorized by chapter two hundred and seventy-  
86 six of the acts of the present year, a sum not  
87 exceeding thirteen hundred dollars.

88 For the salary of the sergeant-at-arms, as  
89 authorized by chapter two hundred and eighty-  
90 four of the acts of the present year, a sum not  
91 exceeding five hundred dollars, the same to be  
92 in addition to the amount appropriated by chap-  
93 ter one of the acts of the present year.

94 For expenses in connection with an investiga-  
95 tion of the wants of the port of Boston for an  
96 improved system of docks and wharves and ter-  
97 minal facilities, as authorized by chapter two  
98 hundred and ninety-one of the acts of the pres-  
99 ent year, a sum not exceeding ten thousand  
100 dollars.

101 For printing extra copies of the report of the  
102 board of registration in medicine, as authorized  
103 by chapter forty-six of the resolves of the pres-  
104 ent year, a sum not exceeding one hundred  
105 dollars.

106 For expenses in connection with an investiga-  
107 tion by the state board of education into the  
108 subject of school attendance and truancy, as  
109 authorized by chapter forty-seven of the re-  
110 solves of the present year, a sum not exceeding  
111 fifteen hundred dollars.

112 For the codification of certain statutes which  
113 the board of registration in pharmacy is required  
114 to enforce, as authorized by chapter forty-eight  
115 of the resolves of the present year, a sum not  
116 exceeding two hundred dollars.

117 For Robert J. Ferris, as authorized by chap-  
118 ter fifty of the resolves of the present year, the  
119 sum of seventy-five dollars.

120 For expenses in completing the collection of  
121 portraits of former governors, as authorized by  
122 chapter fifty-four of the resolves of the present  
123 year, a sum not exceeding one thousand dollars.

124 For certain repairs and improvements at the  
125 state farm in Bridgewater, as authorized by chap-  
126 ter fifty-five of the resolves of the present year, a  
127 sum not exceeding forty-four thousand dollars.

128 For certain repairs and improvements at the  
129 state almshouse at Tewksbury, as authorized by  
130 chapter fifty-six of the resolves of the present  
131 year, a sum not exceeding sixty-seven thousand  
132 three hundred dollars.

133 For certain repairs and improvements at the  
134 Taunton lunatic hospital, as authorized by chap-  
135 ter fifty-seven of the resolves of the present year,  
136 a sum not exceeding twenty thousand five hun-  
137 dred dollars.

138 For repairs and improvements at the West-  
139 borough insane hospital, as authorized by chap-  
140 ter fifty-eight of the resolves of the present year,  
141 a sum not exceeding twelve thousand two hun-  
142 dred and fifty dollars.

143 For building a gymnasium for the state nor-

144 mal school at Worcester, as authorized by chap-  
145 ter fifty-nine of the resolves of the present year,  
146 a sum not exceeding fifteen thousand dollars.

147 For the city of Fitchburg, as authorized by  
148 chapter sixty of the resolves of the present year,  
149 the sum of eight hundred dollars.

150 For printing the report of the joint board on  
151 the improvement of Charles river, made to the  
152 legislature of eighteen hundred and ninety-four,  
153 as authorized by chapter sixty-one of the resolves  
154 of the present year, a sum not exceeding thirteen  
155 hundred and fifty dollars.

156 For printing and distributing the Massachu-  
157 setts military and naval history, as authorized by  
158 chapter sixty-two of the resolves of the present  
159 year, a sum not exceeding seven thousand dol-  
160 lars.

161 For printing fifteen hundred extra copies of  
162 the sixth annual report of the Metropolitan  
163 sewerage commissioners, as authorized by chap-  
164 ter sixty-four of the resolves of the present year,  
165 a sum not exceeding five hundred and sixty  
166 dollars.

167 For painting the representation of the cod-  
168 fish and suspending the same in the chamber of  
169 the house of representatives, as authorized by  
170 by chapter sixty-five of the resolves of the  
171 present year, a sum not exceeding one hundred  
172 dollars.

173 For Sophia H. Coleman, as authorized by  
174 chapter sixty-six of the resolves of the present  
175 year, the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars.

176 For the protection of the town of Agawam  
177 against further encroachment of the Connecti-  
178 cut river, as authorized by chapter sixty-seven  
179 of the resolves of the present year, a sum not  
180 exceeding three thousand dollars.

181 For enlarging the workshops at the Massa-  
182 chusetts hospital for dipsomaniacs and inebri-  
183 ates, as authorized by chapter sixty-nine of the  
184 resolves of the present year, a sum not exceed-  
185 ing three thousand five hundred dollars.

186 For the publication of the report of the com-  
187 mittee appointed to prepare the history of the  
188 codfish suspended in the chamber of the house  
189 of representatives, as authorized by chapter  
190 seventy-one of the resolves of the present year,  
191 a sum not exceeding one thousand dollars.

192 For certain repairs and improvements at the  
193 hospital cottages for children at Baldwinsville,  
194 as authorized by chapter seventy-two of the re-  
195 solves of the present year, a sum not exceeding  
196 twelve thousand dollars.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its  
2 passage.
