

SENATE No. 1229

By Mr. MacLean, a petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 1229) of William Q. MacLean, Jr., for legislation to provide for suspension of a license to operate a motor vehicle upon conviction of violation of the controlled substances act. Public Safety.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR SUSPENSION OF A LICENSE TO OPERATE A MOTOR VEHICLE UPON CONVICTION OF VIOLATION OF THE CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE ACT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law
2 to the contrary, any person convicted of a crime involving
3 controlled substances, except a moving motor vehicle violation,
4 shall have his license to operate a motor vehicle, if any, suspended
5 for a period not to exceed five years. Any person under the age
6 of eighteen and who is not licensed to operate a motor vehicle
7 and who is so convicted shall not be licensed to operate a motor
8 vehicle until such person reaches the age of twenty-one years.
