The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Three.

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR MORE ADEQUATE FACILITIES
FOR REGISTRATION OF VOTERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. In all cities and towns of this common-
2 wealth, the boards of registrars of voters or the elec-
3 tion commissioners, as the case may be, shall hold a
4 registration session before the last day for registra-
5 tion for the biennial state election in any factory,
6 mill, hospital, or any public or private institution, if
7 ten or more voters residing in said city or town shall
8 file with the clerk of said boards or commissions, not
9 less than forty-eight days before the biennial state
10 election, a petition stating that in such factory, mill
11 or institution there are at least ten citizens who are
12 entitled and desire to be registered.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
