

HOUSE No. 1504

By Mr. Keenan of Boston, petition of John B. Hynes (mayor of Boston) and William Francis Keenan relative to the acquisition of the Sumner Tunnel by the Massachusetts Port Authority. State Administration.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Eight.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE ACQUISITION OF THE SUMNER TUNNEL BY THE MASSACHUSETTS PORT AUTHORITY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 8 of chapter 465 of the acts of 1956 is
2 hereby amended by striking out clause (c) and inserting in
3 place thereof the following clause:—

4 (c) Paying to the city, in addition to the sums specified in
5 clauses (b) and (d), the sum of five million, three hundred
6 thousand dollars, and, if title to the Sumner tunnel does not
7 become vested in the Authority on or before December thirty-
8 first, nineteen hundred and fifty-six, interest on said sum and
9 on the sum specified in clause (b) at the rate of three per cent
10 per annum from said December thirty-first to the date of
11 payment.

1 SECTION 2. Section 13 of said chapter 465 is hereby amended
2 by striking out, in lines 3 and 4, the words:— as provided in
3 said section eight (1), (2) and (3),— and inserting in place,
4 thereof the words:— to the purposes specified in clauses (a),
5 (b), (c), (d) and (e) of section eight.

1 SECTION 3. Section 22 of said chapter 465 is hereby amended
2 by inserting after the word "pay", in line 58, the words:—

3 to the state retirement board such sums as said commissioner
 4 shall from time to time determine the commonwealth would be
 5 obliged to pay if such person were an employee of the common-
 6 wealth,— and by striking out the fourth paragraph,— and
 7 by striking from the first sentence of the fifth paragraph the
 8 words “, and the commonwealth and the city shall reimburse
 9 the Authority for their proportionate share of any amounts so
 10 paid.”
