To accompany the petition of John F. O'Sullivan for legislation relative to the cutting and dressing of stone used in the State or municipal work. [Judiciary.]

Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Ninety-five.

AN ACT

Relative to dressing and cutting Stone used in State
or Municipal Work.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. All stone, excepting paving and
2 broken stone, used in state or municipal works
3 within this state, or which is to be worked,
4 dressed or carved for such use, shall be so
5 worked, dressed or carved upon the grounds
6 where such works are being carried on, or within
7 the boundaries of the state, or within the bounda-
8 ries of the municipality. A clause shall be
9 inserted in all specifications or contracts here-

10 after awarded by state, county or municipal
11 authorities, authorizing the use of worked, dressed
12 or carved stone for such use as required by this
13 act.

1 SECT. 2. If any contractor within this state,
2 or a municipal corporation of the state, shall
3 violate any provisions of this act, the state or
4 such municipal corporation shall revoke said con-
5 tract, and shall be discharged for any liability to
6 any contractor by reason of said contract.

1 SECT. 3. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
