**AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE RETIREMENT OF PERSONS HAVING
THIRTY-TWO OR MORE YEARS OF SERVICE.**

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 32, Section 5, Paragraph (c) of Subdivision (2) will
2 then read as follows: —

3 The total normal yearly amount of the retirement allow-
4 ance of any member of group 1 or group 2 or group 4, as
5 determined in accordance with the provisions of this section,
6 shall not exceed nine tenths of the average annual rate of
7 his regular compensation received during any period of three
8 consecutive years of creditable service for which such rate
9 of compensation was the highest or on the average annual
10 rate of regular compensation received by such member dur-
11 ing the period or periods, whether or not consecutive, con-
12 stituting his last three years of creditable service preceding
13 retirement, whichever is the greater.

14 It is requested that the Emergency Preamble be attached
15 to this Bill so that those teachers, retiring as of June 30, 1969,
16 to whom the provisions of this Bill would apply, may benefit
17 from such provisions, if this Bill is enacted into law by June
18 30, 1969.
