The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Two.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A COMMUNITY TECHNICAL SCHOOL BY THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION.

1 Whereas, The college at Fort Devens has been
2 closed and the properties returned to the federal gov-
3 ernment; and

4 Whereas, There is need for the education of veter-
5 ans and others in technical subjects; and

6 Whereas, The commonwealth may be able to ac-
7 quire from the federal government certain of the
8 buildings used in connection with the shipyard lo-
9 cated in the town of Hingham; and

10 Whereas, It would be highly beneficial to the com-
11 monwealth and its citizens to establish a community
12 technical school; therefore

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The department of education is hereby
2 authorized and directed to take steps to acquire from

3 the federal government all or a portion of the build-
4 ings used in connection with the shipyard located in
5 the town of Hingham for the purpose of establishing
6 therein a community technical school.

1 SECTION 2. The said department is hereby author-
2 ized and directed to establish a community technical
3 school in said buildings at Hingham or in some other
4 suitable location. The department shall provide a
5 program of technical education designed to serve the
6 needs of one or more communities within the general
7 area wherein the same is so established.

1 SECTION 3. For the purpose of carrying out the
2 provisions of this act, the sum of two hundred and
3 fifty thousand dollars is hereby appropriated.
