HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, July 23, 1969.

1 *Ordered*, That a joint special committee, to consist of three
2 members of the senate to be designated by the president
3 thereof, eight members of the house of representatives to be
4 designated by the speaker thereof, the membership of which
5 shall be divided as equally as possible between the two major
6 political parties, is hereby authorized and directed to make an
7 immediate investigation of the institutions, programs, financ-
8 ing and philosophy of the division of youth service and any
9 other related matters.

10 Said committee shall be provided with quarters in the state
11 house or elsewhere, shall hold public hearings, may travel
12 within the commonwealth, shall have the power to summon
13 witnesses and to require the production of books, records and
14 papers and the giving of testimony under oath, and may
15 expend for expert, technical, legal, clerical and other services
16 and expenses such sums as may be appropriated therefor.
17 Said committee shall report to the general court the results of
18 its investigation, and its recommendations, if any, together
19 with drafts of legislation necessary to carry its recommenda-
20 tions into effect, by filing the same with the clerk of the house
21 of representatives on or before the first Monday of June of
22 the current year.
