The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Two.

AN ACT FURTHER DEFINING A WORK WEEK WITH REFERENCE TO CERTAIN EMPLOYEES OF THE COMMONWEALTH.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 149 of the General Laws is hereby amended by strik-
2 ing out section 30B, inserted by section 2 of chapter 614 of the
3 acts of 1960, and inserting in place thereof the following section:
4 *Section 30B.* All service in excess of eight hours in any one
5 tour of duty or forty hours in any one work week rendered by
6 any employee of the commonwealth at the request of an officer
7 of the commonwealth or other person whose duty it is to employ,
8 direct or control such employee, except the state police uniformed
9 force and detectives, metropolitan district police, fire prevention
10 engineer, boatswain coastal patrol boat, captain coastal patrol
11 boat, coastal warden coastal patrol boat, coastal warden eng-
12 neer coastal patrol boat, industrial relations adjuster, teachers,
13 armorers, elected officers, appointees of the governor, heads of
14 departments and divisions and their deputies and assistants, in-
15 cumbents of the positions of superintendents, assistant superin-
16 tendents, deputy superintendents, stewards, physicians, dentists,
17 head farmer, business manager, institution chief power plant en-
18 gineers at mental health, public health, correctional institutions,
19 soldiers' home in Massachusetts and agencies under the jurisdic-
20 tion of the division of youth service, the manager of the boarding
21 hall at the university of Massachusetts and the adjutants of the

22 soldiers' homes in Massachusetts, shall be compensated for at
23 the rate of one and one half times the regular hourly rate for said
24 employee for every hour or fraction thereof of such services
25 rendered. The work week shall embrace any seven consecutive
26 days. It need not coincide with the calendar week, but may
27 begin on any day or time of any day. The beginning of the
28 work week may be changed if the change is initiated to be regu-
29 lar, and not to evade the overtime requirements of this section.
30 The director of personnel and standardization is empowered to
31 make rules and regulations, subject to the approval of the com-
32 mission on administration and finance, to carry out the provi-
33 sions of this section.
