

tons, or a motor vehicle carrying bulk feed, or a construction type semitrailer unit or motor vehicle having three axles, or a semitrailer unit or motor vehicle having three axles while carrying liquid petroleum products, which vehicle with its load weighs not more than thirty tons, may travel on a way while engaged in hauling construction materials or liquid petroleum products or bulk feed without a permit as required by said section thirty of chapter eighty-five; provided, that the gross weight of such vehicle as operated does not exceed the gross vehicle weight rating as established by the original manufacturer of the chassis; and provided, further, that the vehicle is duly registered in this commonwealth for such weight.

**Chap. 128.** AN ACT AUTHORIZING CITIES, TOWNS AND DISTRICTS TO ENTER INTO CONTRACTS FOR THE PURCHASE OF FUEL OIL AND OTHER FUEL SUPPLIES.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

Section 4 of chapter 40 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after the paragraph inserted by chapter 71 of the acts of 1971 the following paragraph: —

For the purchase of oil and other fuel supplies. Contracts for such purposes may be made for periods not exceeding three years.

**Chap. 129.** AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE UNITARIAN UNIVERSALIST CHURCH IN SIXTEEN ACRES TO MERGE WITH THIRD CONGREGATIONAL SOCIETY IN SPRINGFIELD.

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

SECTION 1. Unitarian Universalist Church in Sixteen Acres, a corporation established under chapter one hundred and eighty of the General Laws, is hereby authorized to merge with Third Congregational Society in Springfield, a corporation established by chapter eighty-six of the acts of eighteen hundred and eighteen under the name "Second Congregational Society in the First Parish in Springfield", and the name of which was altered to its present form under authority of chapter eighty-two of the acts of eighteen hundred and nineteen.

SECTION 2. Upon the completion of the merger authorized as aforesaid, Unitarian Universalist Church in Sixteen Acres shall no longer continue as a separate corporation and Third Congregational Society in Springfield under its existing corporate powers may carry on the activities heretofore carried on by said Unitarian Universalist Church in Sixteen Acres as part of the activities of said Third Congregational Society in Springfield, and all persons who were members of said Unitarian Universalist Church in Sixteen Acres shall become members of said Third Congregational Society in Springfield.

SECTION 3. Upon such merger becoming effective, all property of Unitarian Universalist Church in Sixteen Acres, including all bequests, devises, gifts and transfers of any kind heretofore and hereafter made for its benefit, shall be transferred to and vest in Third Congregational Society in Springfield without further act or deed, and said Third Congregational Society in Springfield shall have the same powers, rights and privileges with respect to the property of Unitarian Universalist
