AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE OBSERVANCE OF CAPTIVE NATIONS' DAY.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 6 of the General Laws is hereby amended by add-  
2 ing after section 151, the following section:—

3 *Section 15J.* The governor shall annually issue a proclama-  
4 tion setting apart August fifteenth as Captive Nations' Day,  
5 recommending that the day be observed by the people in the  
6 display of the flag commemorative of the citizens of iron cur-  
7 tain countries who have been fighting for freedom against great  
8 odds.
