AN ACT REMOVING THE POSITION OF ASSISTANT ASSESSOR IN THE TOWN OF ARLINGTON FROM THE PROVISIONS OF CIVIL SERVICE

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to  
2 the contrary, the position of assistant assessor in the town of  
3 Arlington is hereby removed from the provisions of chapter  
4 thirty-one, the civil service law.

1 SECTION 2. This law shall take effect upon its passage.

ARTICLE 79. PETITION TO THE GENERAL COURT REMOVING THE POSITION OF ASSISTANT ASSESSOR FROM THE PROVISIONS OF CIVIL SERVICE

VOTED: (Standing Vote, 87 in the affirmative and 54 in the negative) That the Board of Selectmen be and hereby is directed to file the following legislation with the General Court:

AN ACT REMOVING THE POSITION OF ASSISTANT ASSESSOR IN THE TOWN OF ARLINGTON FROM THE PROVISIONS OF CIVIL SERVICE.

Section 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the position of Assistant Assessor in the Town of Arlington is hereby removed from the provisions of Chapter 31, the Civil Service Law.

Section 2. This law shall take effect upon its passage.
