AN ACT AUTHORIZING OFFICIAL BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS OF A TOWN TO PLACE SUBJECTS ON TOWN MEETING WARRANTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The sixth sentence of Chapter Thirty-nine, section ten of the
2 General Laws shall be stricken and the following sentence
3 inserted in its place: — The selectmen shall insert in the warrant
4 for the annual meeting all subjects the insertion of which shall
5 be requested of them in writing by ten or more registered voters
6 of the town or by the majority vote of any official board or
7 commission of the town and in the warrant for every special
8 town meeting all subjects the insertion of which shall be
9 requested of them in writing by one hundred registered voters or
10 by ten percent of the total number of registered voters of the
11 town whichever number is the lesser or by the unanimous vote
12 of any official board or commission of the town.
