AN ACT

To authorize the City of Salem to confine the Sale of Intoxicating Liquors within Definite Territorial Limits.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The city of Salem may, by ordi-
2 nance, restrict the power of granting licenses for
3 the sale of spirituous or intoxicating liquors
4 under the provisions of chapter one hundred of
5 the Public Statutes to any prescribed and defined
6 district or districts of the territory of said city,
7 with such exceptions as the city council of said
8 city may prescribe; and thereafter no license for
9 the sale of spirituous or intoxicating liquors in
10 any part of said territory not comprised in said
11 district or districts shall be granted, except in
12 accordance with such ordinance.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 acceptance by the city council of said city.
