AN ACT

Concerning Attorneys at Law.

1 **BE** it enacted by the Senate and House of Repre-
2 sentatives in General Court assembled, and by the au-
3 thority of the same.

1 SEC. 1. Every inhabitant of the state, of the age
2 of twenty-one years, and of good moral character,
3 shall be admitted to practice as an Attorney in any
4 court of this Commonwealth, if he shall have filed
5 with the clerk of the court of common pleas, or of
6 the supreme judicial court, a written notice of his
7 intention so to practice, together with proof satisfac-

8 tory to the court that he is of the requisite age and
9 character.

1 SEC. 2. The nineteenth and twentieth sections of
2 the eighty-eighth chapter of the Revised Statutes, are
3 hereby repealed.
