

# HOUSE . . . . . No. 5826

By Mr. McGlynn of Medford, petition of Michael J. McGlynn, Richard P. Roche and Richard A. Voke relative to imposing a two year moratorium on the approval of construction of any liquified natural gas or liquified petroleum gas storage facility and prohibiting the approval of routes for the transportation of such gas. Public Safety.

## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty.

AN ACT IMPOSING A LIMITED MORATORIUM ON THE APPROVAL OF ANY SITE OR TRANSPORTATION OF LIQUEFIED NATURAL GAS OR LIQUEFIED PETROLEUM GAS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 69G  
2 through 69R of chapter 164 of the General Laws or any other law,  
3 general or special to the contrary, the energy facilities siting coun-  
4 cil shall not approve the construction of any liquefied natural gas  
5 or liquefied petroleum gas storage or conversion facility for a  
6 period of two years from the effective date of this act.

1 SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any provisions of law, general  
2 or special to the contrary, no department, agency or board of the  
3 commonwealth shall approve or certify any route for the transpor-  
4 tation of liquefied natural gas or liquefied petroleum gas for a  
5 period of two years from the effective date of this act.
