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AN ACT

Relative to the Inspection of Steam Boilers.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section two of chapter four hundred and  
2 eighteen of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and  
3 ninety-five is hereby amended by inserting after the word  
4 "one" in the second line the words "and not therein ex-  
5 cepted," so as to read as follows:—

6 *Section 2.* Each of the boilers designated in section  
7 one and not therein excepted shall be inspected by the  
8 inspector of boilers for the district in which said boiler  
9 or boilers is located, as thoroughly as in the judgment of  
10 the inspector is necessary, and if the inspector so directs,  
11 it shall be the duty of the owner or user to have the  
12 boiler or boilers blown off dry, and the man-hole and the  
13 hand-hole covers thereon removed, ready for inspection  
14 upon the day designated by the inspector, the inspector  
15 giving the owner or user of said boiler or boilers four-  
16 teen days' notice in writing of the day upon which he  
17 will make such internal inspection.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
