AN ACT

Making Appropriations for the Massachusetts Agricultural College.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned are
2 appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury of the
3 commonwealth, from the ordinary revenue, for the
4 Massachusetts Agricultural College, for the fiscal
5 year ending on the thirtieth day of November, nine-
6 teen hundred and ten, to wit:—

7 For providing one hundred and twenty free schol-
8 arships, the sum of fifteen thousand dollars. (Acts
9 1909, ch. 436.)

(Appropriation 1909, \$15,000.)

10 For providing the theoretical and practical educa-
11 tion required by the charter of the college and by
12 the laws of the United States relating thereto, the
13 sum of thirty-seven thousand and five hundred dol-
14 lars. (Acts 1909, ch. 436.)

(Appropriation 1909, \$30,000.)

15 For the general maintenance of the college, in-
16 cluding heat, light and water, the sum of fifteen
17 thousand dollars. (Acts 1909, ch. 436.)

(Appropriation 1909, \$12,000.)

18 For a graduate school, the sum of twenty-five
19 hundred dollars. (Acts 1909, ch. 436.)

(No appropriation 1909.)

20 For a labor fund for the assistance of needy stu-
21 dents, the sum of seventy-five hundred dollars.
22 (Acts 1909, ch. 436.)

(No appropriation 1909.)

23 For maintenance of the veterinary laboratory,
24 the sum of one thousand dollars. (Acts 1909, ch.
25 436.)

(Appropriation 1909, \$1,000.)

26 For maintaining an agricultural experiment sta-
27 tion, the sum of ten thousand five hundred dollars.
28 (Acts 1909, ch. 436.)

(Appropriation 1909, \$10,500.)

29 For collecting and analyzing samples of concen-
30 trated commercial feed stuffs, a sum not exceeding
31 three thousand dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 57, sect.
32 20; Acts 1909, ch. 436.)

(Appropriation 1909, \$3,000.)

33 For travelling and other necessary expenses of
34 the trustees a sum not exceeding eight hundred dol-
35 lars. (Acts 1909, ch. 436.)

(Appropriation 1909, \$800.)

36 For printing and binding the reports of the trus-
37 tees, a sum not exceeding three thousand dollars.
38 (Acts 1902, ch. 438; 1908, ch. 459.)

(Appropriation 1909, \$3,000.)

39 For establishment of a normal department for
40 the purpose of giving instruction in the elements

41 of agriculture to persons desiring to teach such ele-
42 ments in the public schools, the sum of five thou-
43 sand dollars. (Acts 1906, ch. 505, sect. 7; 1909, ch.
44 436.)

(Appropriation 1909, \$5,000.)

45 For short courses in agriculture, the sum of sev-
46 enty-five hundred dollars. (Acts 1909, ch. 436.)

(Appropriation 1909, \$5,000.)

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
