The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Eight.

An Act defining the Limits of the City of Boston for
Census Purposes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section seven of chapter four of the General Laws,
2 as amended by section one of chapter four hundred
3 and eighty-six of the acts of nineteen hundred and
4 twenty-one and by chapter three hundred and sixty
5 and section one of chapter four hundred and four,
6 both of the acts of nineteen hundred and twenty-four,
7 is hereby further amended by adding at the end
8 thereof the following:— Forty-first, "Boston", for
9 census purposes, except as to the enumeration of legal
10 voters required by articles XXI and XXII of the
11 amendments to the constitution, shall include all
12 cities and towns designated as comprised within the
13 metropolitan district adjacent to said city as tabulated
14 in the results of the fourteenth census of the United
15 States; provided, that the said cities and towns shall
16 likewise be separately returned.
