AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE DISTRIBUTION OF PARI-MUTUEL WAGERING MONIES TO CITIES AND TOWNS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section eighteen D of chapter fifty-eight of the
2 General Laws, as appearing in the nineteen hundred and eighty-
3 eight Official Edition, is hereby repealed.

1 SECTION 2. All persons licensed to conduct racing meetings,
2 including any meetings conducted in connection with a state or
3 county fair, under licenses issued under the provisions of chapter
4 one hundred and twenty-eight A of the General Laws shall
5 quarterly pay and distribute to the city or town within which such
6 meetings are conducted in which a major portion of the racing
7 strip is located, the sum of one quarter of one per cent of the total
8 pari-mutuel wages from each such race track within said city or
9 town for the previous three months which sum shall be deducted
10 from the commonwealth's share.
