In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Ninety-nine.

AN ACT

To authorize the Cambridge Bridge Commission, with the Consent of the United States Government, to construct without a Draw the Bridge to be built between Boston and Cambridge.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The bridge to be built by the
2 Cambridge bridge commission according to the
3 provisions of chapter four hundred and sixty-seven
4 of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and
5 ninety-eight may, with the consent of the United
6 States government, be constructed without a
7 draw; and if so constructed it shall be of a height,
8 over the main ship channel, of not less than
9 twenty-six feet above mean high water; and the
10 distance between the piers on each side of said
11 channel shall be at least forty feet.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
