## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Five.

AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE REIMBURSEMENT OF CITIES AND TOWNS FOR EXPENSES INCURRED FOR THE BURIAL OF CERTAIN DEPENDENTS OF VETERANS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 8 of chapter 115 of the General Laws is hereby amended  
2 by striking out the second sentence of said section and inserting  
3 therein the following:— No city or town shall be reimbursed  
4 under this section for any amount so expended for any single  
5 burial if the total expense of said burial, exclusive of the purchase  
6 price of the grave, the cost of the grave opening and the cost of a  
7 cement vault liner, if one is required by the cemetery regulations,  
8 by whomsoever incurred, exceeds three hundred dollars for a  
9 child under the age of seven, or seven hundred and fifty dollars  
10 for any other person.
