The Committee on the Library, to whom was committed "the subject of distributing by lot the remaining copies of the Geological Report, and of the State Papers on Nullification,

REPORT :

That in regard to the State Papers on Nullification, they have already been placed, by a legislative act, at the disposal of the Executive Branch of the Government.

Of the first edition of the Geological Survey the Committee have taken no cognizance, the few remaining copies having also been placed at the disposal of the Executive.

Of the second edition of the Geological Survey there remains one hundred and two copies. It is the opinion of the Committee that copies should be given to the principal Universities or Colleges in the United States, and also to the most distinguished Societies for the advancement of Physical Science. These institutions, thought by the Committee to be proper objects of this attention, from the Legislature, amount to forty-two.

The Committee also think, (and may be permitted to say, that it has been suggested by the author of the Geological Survey,) that copies should be sent to some of the principal Societies for the promotion of Natural Science in Europe. These, so far as the Committee have ascertained, are twenty-three in number, which added to those proposed to be given to our own institutions, amount to sixty-five. The Committee have probably overlooked some of the societies at home and abroad which should have been included.

For the Distribution of the Report of the Geological
Survey of this Commonwealth.

Resolved, That His Honor the Lieutenant Governor be authorized and requested to transmit to the several institutions and persons following, a copy of the second edition of the Geological Survey of the Commonwealth, viz:—to Bowdoin College, Waterville College, Dartmouth College, Vermont University, Middlebury College, Harvard College, Williams College, Amherst College, Brown University, Yale College, Washington College, Wesleyan University, being all in New-England; also to Columbia College and Union College, N. Y.; Princeton College, N. J.; Pennsylvania University in Philadelphia; Maryland University; Columbia College, D. C.; William and Mary College, and the University of Virginia, Va.; North Carolina University; South Carolina College; Georgia University; Alabama University; Jefferson College, Mississippi; Louisiana Col-
