AN ACT EXTENDING THE TIME WITHIN WHICH CERTAIN SOLDIERS AND SAILORS AND THEIR WIVES, WIDOWS, FATHERS OR MOTHERS MAY FILE APPLICATIONS FOR ABATEMENT OR EXEMPTION OF TAXES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 534 of the acts of 1949 is hereby amended  
2 by striking out section 3, as amended by chapter 301  
3 of the acts of 1951, and inserting in place thereof the  
4 following section: —

5 *Section 3.* Application for abatement or exemption,  
6 as provided in section five of chapter fifty-nine of the  
7 General Laws, of taxes levied in the years nineteen  
8 hundred and fifty-two and nineteen hundred and fifty-  
9 three may be made not later than October first, nine-  
10 teen hundred and fifty-four, notwithstanding any  
11 provision of law to the contrary.
