The Committee on Prisons, to whom was referred the Bill in relation to the State Prison, report that the same ought to pass in a new draft, as a Resolve, herewith submitted.

RESOLVE

In relation to the new State Prison at Concord.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid out of the treasury, and the same is hereby appropriated, — for bedsteads for convicts, a sum not exceeding six thousand eight hundred dollars; for the removal of convicts to Concord, and of the State property, officers' furniture, &c., a sum not exceeding two thousand dollars; for furnishing offices at new prison, a sum not exceeding fifteen hundred dollars; for fencing, &c., for twenty houses, a sum not exceeding five hundred dollars; for carpeting warden's and deputy-warden's houses, a sum not exceeding twelve hundred dollars; for building piggery, coal-shed, &c., a sum not exceeding two thousand five hundred dollars; for lumber for fencing around stable, and for other necessary purposes, a sum not exceeding two thousand five hundred dollars; for stone for walls, and edge-stone for walks, a sum not exceeding one thousand dollars: *provided* that the amounts herein appropriated shall be paid from the unexpended balance of the appropriation for construction, if any; otherwise out of the treasury of the Commonwealth.
