AN ACT MAKING TEMPORARY PROVISION FOR CONTINUING
THE PRESENT LAWFUL USE OF CERTAIN BUILDINGS
PENDING THE ISSUE OF CERTIFICATES OF INSPECTION
BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY.

1 *Whereas*, It is necessary that this act take effect
2 earlier than ninety days after it becomes a law in
3 order to prevent interruption of the present lawful
4 use of certain buildings, therefore this act is hereby
5 declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the
6 immediate preservation of the public convenience.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Any acknowledgment of an applica-
2 tion to an inspector of the division of inspection of the
3 department of public safety for a certificate of inspec-
4 tion under section twenty-eight of chapter one hun-
5 dred and forty-three of the General Laws, as amended
6 by section three of chapter five hundred and forty-four
7 of the acts of nineteen hundred and forty-three, which
8 shall have been renewed as provided in section twenty-
9 nine of said chapter one hundred and forty-three, as
10 amended by said section three, may be further re-
11 newed at any time before March first, nineteen hun-
12 dred and forty-seven in like manner and with like

13 effect for such further periods of not more than ninety
14 days each as circumstances may require, pending the
15 granting or refusal of the certificate. Such an acknowl-
16 edgment may be revoked by an inspector, without a
17 hearing and without the assignment of any cause
18 therefor, at any time when in his opinion the public
19 safety requires.

1 SECTION 2. Any such acknowledgment which has
2 ceased since September tenth, nineteen hundred and
3 forty-three to have effect by reason solely of the ex-
4 piration of the period of renewal authorized by said
5 section twenty-nine is hereby revived for the period
6 of thirty days after the effective date of this act for
7 the sole purpose of permitting a further renewal of
8 such acknowledgment under section one of this act,
9 the provisions of which section shall authorize renewals
10 thereof to the same extent as though such period had
11 not expired.
