By Mr. Lewis R. Sullivan, Jr., of Boston, petition of Frank A. Goodwin, for the Commonwealth Service Association, that laborers and mechanics employed by the Commonwealth be given Saturday holidays without loss of pay. Public Service.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-One.

An Act to provide that Laborers, Workmen and Mechanics employed by the Commonwealth may be given a Full Holiday on Saturdays without Loss of Pay.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter one hundred and forty-nine of the Gen-
2 eral Laws is hereby amended by striking out section
3 forty-one and inserting in the place thereof the
4 following:—

5 *Section 41.* Except as provided in section sixty-
6 five of chapter ninety-two, all laborers, workmen
7 and mechanics employed by the commonwealth in
8 any capacity, or by any officer, department or board
9 on behalf of the commonwealth, who are permanent
10 employees, or who have been certified under the
11 civil service laws, and whose services can be dis-
12 pensed with, shall be given a half holiday on every

13 Saturday in the year without loss of pay or at the
14 discretion of the governor and council may be given
15 a full holiday on Saturday without loss of pay during
16 such portions of the year as may be determined
17 upon.
