AN ACT AUTHORIZING MUNICIPALITIES TO APPROPRIATE MONEY FOR
HEARING AIDS FOR NEEDY SCHOOL CHILDREN.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 5 of chapter 40 of the General Laws is hereby amended
2 by striking out clause (40), inserted by chapter 185 of the acts
3 of 1937, and inserting in place thereof the following clause: —
4 (40) To provide eyeglasses, spectacles and hearing aids for
5 school children eighteen years of age or under who are in need
6 thereof and whose parents or guardians are financially unable
7 to furnish the same. Money so appropriated shall be expended
8 under the direction of the mayor and city council of a city and
9 the selectmen of a town.

AN ACT TO ESTABLISH A COMMISSION ON THE STATUS OF WOMEN AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE REPORT OF SUCH COMMISSION.

Section 1. (a) There is established a Commission on the Status of Women, to be known as the Commission on the Status of Women, to study and report on the status of women in the United States.

(b) The Commission shall be composed of such members as the President shall appoint, and shall submit a report to the President not later than one year after the date of the appointment of its members.

(c) The Commission shall have the honor and privilege of access to all places, buildings, and records of the Federal Government, and shall have the right to hold public hearings and to receive testimony and to examine records and documents.
