AN ACT PROHIBITING THE USE OF BUILDINGS AND OTHER PLACES FOR IMPROPER DISPOSITION OF HARMFUL DRUGS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 94 of the General Laws is hereby amended by in-
- 2 serting after section 187F the following section:—
- 3 *Section 187G.* No person, whether owner, tenant or oc-
- 4 cupant, shall permit a vehicle, boat, aircraft, building or other
- 5 place owned or occupied by him to be used for the illegal
- 6 possession, sale or dispensation of harmful drugs, nor shall
- 7 he allow persons who use or are addicted to said drugs to
- 8 frequent such place.
- 9 Whoever violates the provisions of this section shall be
- 10 punished by a fine of not more than two thousand dollars or
- 11 by imprisonment in a jail or house of correction for not more
- 12 than two years, or by imprisonment in the state prison for
- 13 not more than three years.
