By Mr. Jordan of Revere, petition of Joseph L. Carr and others relative to the tenure of office of the assessors of the city of Revere and to the manner of their election and removal. Civil Service.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Forty-Eight.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE TENURE OF OFFICE OF THE ASSESSORS OF THE CITY OF REVERE AND TO THE MANNER OF THEIR ELECTION AND REMOVAL.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Each assessor of the city of Revere
2 in office at the time this act takes effect and any
3 person thereafter elected to fill any vacancy existing
4 in such office shall hold office during good behavior
5 and until the city council shall remove him there-
6 from in accordance with the provisions of chapter
7 thirty-one of the General Laws and the rules and
8 regulations made thereunder relative to removals
9 from the classified public service. After this act takes
10 effect, any vacancy in the office of assessor in said
11 city shall be filled by election by its city council.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall be submitted to the
2 voters of said city at the state election in the current

3 year in the form of the following question which shall
 4 be placed upon the official ballot to be used in said
 5 city at said election: "Shall an act passed by the
 6 general court in the year nineteen hundred and forty-
 7 eight, entitled 'An Act relative to the Tenure of
 8 Office of the Assessors of the City of Revere and to
 9 the Manner of their Election and Removal', be ac-
 10 cepted?" If a majority of the votes cast
 11 on said question are in the affirmative,
 12 this act shall take full effect, but not
 13 otherwise.
