RESOLUTIONS MEMORIALIZING THE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES TO REVISE THE AGRICULTURAL ADJUSTMENT ACT FOR THE PURPOSE OF LOWERING THE HIGH COST OF LIVING.

1 *Whereas*, The laws which support prices of farm
2 products were enacted to relieve an acute national
3 economic emergency affecting the farm industry; and

4 *Whereas*, The economy of the American people is
5 being jeopardized constantly by the present form of
6 the agricultural adjustment act; and

7 *Whereas*, The economy of the farm industry is no
8 longer in a state of acute national economic emer-
9 gency; and

10 *Whereas*, The economy of many American families
11 is being aggravated by the present form of the agricul-
12 tural adjustment act; therefore be it

13 *Resolved*, That the general court of Massachusetts
14 memorializes the Congress of the United States to
15 enact laws that will bring about a revision of the
16 agricultural adjustment act to a more realistic basis
17 to the end that an effective step shall be taken to
18 lower the high cost of living; and be it further

19 *Resolved*, That copies of these resolutions be trans-
20 mitted forthwith by the state secretary to the Presi-
21 dent of the United States to the presiding officer of
22 each branch of Congress, and to the members thereof
23 from this commonwealth.
