

CHAP. LXXII.

An Act to increase the pay of Jurors in certain cases.

BE it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, That each Juror who shall hereafter attend on a summons issued on a complaint in relation to the locating, altering or discontinuing any High-way, Town-way or Private-way, or to the estimating damages occasioned thereby, shall receive one dollar and twenty-five cents for each day's attendance, and six cents for each mile travelled therefor each way.

CHAP. LXXIII.

An Act in addition to an Act entitled "An Act to regulate the burning of Coal Pits in the towns of Plymouth, Kingston, Carver and Wareham in the County of Plymouth, and Sandwich, in the County of Barnstable."

SEC. 1. **BE** it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, That no person shall hereafter put, keep, maintain, or permit to be put, kept or maintained, any fire to, or in any Coal Pit, or to any pile or parcel of wood, in any of the wood lands in the towns of Plymouth, Kingston, Carver, or Wareham aforesaid, or either of them, for the purpose of charring the same, or put, keep or main-

Fires shall not be kept in coal pits, &c.
