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AN ACT ABOLISHING THE MASSACHUSETTS BAY TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY, TRANSFERRING THE POWERS, DUTIES AND PROPERTIES OF SAID AUTHORITY TO THE MASSACHUSETTS PORT AUTHORITY.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Notwithstanding the provisions of any law to the contrary,
- 2 thirty days after the effective date of this act, the Massachusetts
- 3 Bay Transportation Authority is hereby abolished and on said
- 4 date the powers, duties and properties of said Authority are to
- 5 be transferred to the Massachusetts Port Authority.
